

What is Animal Safety Net?

It is a program that offers a safe haven for pets, and provides peace of mind for people who are displaced from their homes by emergencies. The program helps survivors of domestic violence and those who are suddenly homeless who need a temporary place for their pets to stay.

Animal Safety Net is the only formal program of its kind in New England. It is modeled by Monadnock Humane Society (MHS) after similar programs elsewhere in the country, including Los Angeles, CA.

Animal Safety Net Helps People and Pets When There Is No Alternative

Victims of Domestic Abuse

- Enabling individuals and families to leave a dangerous situation

People Experiencing Emergencies or Other Life Challenges

- Being admitted for substance abuse rehabilitation
- Becoming homeless (after fire, floods, job loss or other situations)

Pets

- Receive refuge in temporary, loving foster homes



Most shelters for domestic violence victims and the homeless, or substance abuse rehab centers, do not allow pets.

Research Shows

- 🐾 People will choose to live outside in freezing conditions and remain homeless rather than leave their pets behind
- 🐾 Some will stay in a dangerous situation rather than abandon their pets in homes during a natural disaster
- 🐾 Abusers may neglect, threaten, torture or otherwise hurt pets as a way to control or torment partners and children

How Does MHS Animal Safety Net Work?

A caseworker or client advocate must first make contact through the agencies we have partnerships* with.

Once arrangements have been made through a partner agency, the pet transfer can take place at:

- Monadnock Humane Society
- A pre-designated, safe drop-off location
- The client's house (if it is safe to do so)

*Current partner agencies include: Monadnock Center for Violence Prevention, Shelter From The Storm, Southwestern Community Services, and Hundred Nights Shelter.

What Does MHS Animal Safety Net Provide?

- **Free housing** for most types of pets at MHS or in safe, undisclosed foster homes that are screened and receive continual support
- **Veterinary care**, vaccines, microchipping and a spay/neuter surgery for pets as needed
- **Photos and periodic updates** about the pets
