

Shelter design, Part 1: Key takeaways

- 1. First, <u>make sure your shelter operations are running smoothly</u>, your organization has clear goals, and you have the right leadership to oversee a major building project.
- 2. Carefully weigh the pros and cons of building a new facility versus renovating your current one. A consultation with a shelter design expert can help you make this call.
- 3. <u>Don't build cheap and fast</u>. If you urgently need more space, consider renting space or purchasing construction trailers while you're planning and constructing a new facility.
- 4. <u>Recruit a knowledgeable project team</u>, including someone with in-depth knowledge of the construction industry and a shelter design expert.
- 5. <u>Conduct a needs assessment</u> focused on your current needs and future goals. Solicit ideas from your staff, board members and community.
- 6. Learn what other animal welfare organizations in your community are doing and their future plans. <u>Develop a cohesive community plan</u> for meeting animal welfare needs.
- 7. <u>Make sure any land</u> you buy will serve your needs. Consult a shelter design expert before you purchase.
- 8. <u>Tour other shelters</u> and find out what their staff like about their new facilities—and what they would do differently.
