he travels safely.

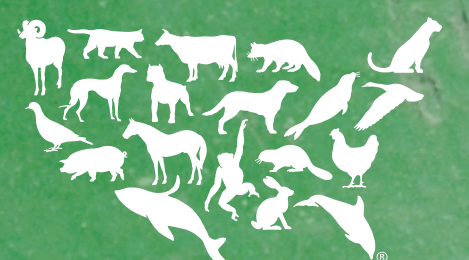
We know it's tempting. It's convenient, and dogs seem to love riding there.

Some of the worst cases are those animals whose owners, trying to make their ride safer, leash the dog into the truck. Then the truck takes a turn a little too fast, and the dog strangles on the restraint.

We know. We've seen the aftermath, and we know the heartbreak and guilt that follows.

Don't let this happen to you and your beloved pet. Your dog is safest in the cab with you, or—if that's not possible—in a crate carefully strapped down in the back of the truck (if you're traveling a long way, make sure it's not too hot for him to ride there).
