Virus shed in the saliva of an infected cat



Primarily transmitted via a deep bite wound




Remains asymptomatic for life

Progression to clinical disease


FeLV Pathophysiology



Virus shed in the saliva and other bodily fluids of an infected cat



Primarily transmitted from queens to kittens (some risk of transmission from prolonged contact or bite wounds)



Regressive infection

become progressive

Progressive infection

Will develop clinical signs

May remain asymptomatic for life

Can become progressive with inciting cause
